

## **PRESIDENT OF COLOMBIA, JUAN MANUEL SANTOS AND REPSOL CHAIRMAN, ANTONIO BRUFAU, VISIT SILURO-1 WELL EXPLORATION PLATFORM**

- **The president of Colombia, Juan Manuel Santos, and members of his cabinet, together with the president and the CEO of Repsol, Antonio Brufau and Josu Jon Imaz, visited the platform where the company is exploring for hydrocarbons in Colombian waters.**
- **The Siluro-1 well, operated by Repsol, is located within the RC-11 block in the Guajira Basin on Colombia's Caribbean coastline.**
- **Colombia is one of the company's key development areas; Repsol has various important hydrocarbon exploration and production projects in the country.**

Colombian president Juan Manuel Santos, Repsol president Antonio Brufau and CEO Josu Jon Imaz visited the offshore platform of the Siluro-1 well together with Colombia's Minister of Mines and Energy, Germán Arce, and Minister of Environment and Sustainable Development Luis Gilberto Murillo, among other Colombian authorities.

The Siluro-1 well, operated by Repsol, is located 42 kilometers from the coast of Colombia, within the La Guajira department in the Caribbean Sea. It is an exploratory project currently in the drilling phase. Repsol holds a 50% share, while the remaining 50% belongs to Ecopetrol.

Colombia is one of Repsol's key development areas; the company has been present there since 1983. Repsol currently produces about 20,000 barrels of oil equivalent per day and has mineral rights to 18 blocks, 11 of which are in the exploration phase.
